Eastern-Midlands Waste Prevention Projects	
Dun Laoghaire- Rathdown County Council	Promote reduction of single use plastic items in the Sandyford Business district and help create an environmentally sustainable image to add to its attractiveness as a business destination. Will involve working with an expected 6 businesses, including assessments, actions, and dissemination.
South Dublin County Council	Installing public water drinking fonts in a number of locations like park runs, playgrounds, and playing pitches, with meters to record usage, surveys of the park run group events to gauge existing plastic bottle use levels, engagement with local sports clubs, and investigating the use of QR codes on the fonts for promotion.
Laois County Council	Measures to green a local community, including installing a compost unit at a new community hub with compost being reused in the village, educational activities in the hub and wider community, and an energy efficiency audit at the community hall.
Longford County Council	Putting together a Repair & Reuse directory for Co. Longford, getting the companies and individuals to sign up directly to the repairmystuff.ie website, and a launch and dissemination through Tidy Towns and community groups in the county.
Louth County Council	Phase 2 of the Stop Food Waste School Cooking Programme with local chef Tara Walker. Involves a series of 5 cooking demonstrations in two schools with an emphasis on reducing food waste, with participants cooking the dishes at home between demos.
Wicklow County Council	Tackle the growing use of single use cleaning products designed for individual tasks, e.g. sprays and wipes. Aims to look at the cost of this convenience and develop a short video clip, a series of gifs, and a poster showcasing the financial and environmental costs of such single use items, and looking at alternatives. Following on from successful installation of bottle filling water fountains in schools last year, to install such fountains in libraries and further schools.
Dublin City Council	Pilot and test the business case and social acceptance of a deposit and return coffee cup scheme in a number of campus canteens/cafes in Dublin, with a supporting communication strategy, and a quantitative (volume of disposable cups removed) and qualitative (user behaviour and feedback) assessment.
Westmeath County Council	Year 1 of a 3-year programme: Development of a Green Festival Kit for small, local festivals to include promotional material on resource efficiency and promote waste prevention awareness during festivals. Start working towards greening the Fleadh in Mullingar in 2020 and 2021

Cavan County Council	Business sector Initiative, create a network of business locations to provide free drinking water refills supported by Refill.ie Household & Community Sector Initiative, and provision of a brown bin awareness pilot scheme.

Galway County Council	Deliver Food Waste Prevention Programmes throughout the County during 2019 in 3/4 communities. Develop public potable water points in a number of Council buildings and encourage communities to develop such points. Greening events and developing a Green Festivals pack.
Mayo County Council	Hold a showcase event promoting use of tap water rather than bottled water on May day. Hold a Refill.ie education event for Mayo County Council staff in County Buildings in 2019. Install 3 more Refill stations in 3 public leisure centres. Support an upgrade of refill points in 3 secondary schools

Limerick City & County Council	<p>Training workshops for staff in the Local Authority development sector, such as architects, quantity surveyors, project managers, and procurement staff, in the principles of designing out waste.</p>
Tipperary County Council	<p>Workshops on how to reduce food waste and single use plastic.</p> <p>A water filling station for a school.</p>
